Adding the suffix /tion/ to the root word to change verbs to nouns sounds like /shun/ but we spell it /tion/

If the word ends in /t/ or /te/ , spell the word, remove the /t/ or /te/ and simply add /tion/. Adding /tion/ to words with no root word, simply spell the word and choose to use /tion/. Remember it sounds like /shun/.
